

### GENERAL INFORMATION

### **Target Audience**

Psychiatrists, Psychologists, Social Workers, Psychoanalysts, and other mental health professionals.

### **Educational Objectives of This Program**

This program will examine the historical and theoretical legacy as well as the clinical contributions of one of the earliest and greatest psychoanalytic pioneers, Sandor Ferenczi of Budapest.

Participants will learn of the relevance of Ferenczi's contributions to contemporary psychoanalytic theory and practice.

The recent publication, in English, of Ferenczi's CLINICAL DIARY and the anticipated publication, in English, of the FREUD-FERENCZI CORRESPONDENCE, offers a new generation of analysists the opportunity to encounter the work of this seminal thinker. Ferenczi's work is largely concerned with the heart of the analytic situation, the relationship between patient and analysist. Foremost among his contributions are heightened emphasis on: (1) primitive (pre-oedipal) forms of relationship, (2) the role of regression, (3) reexamining the role of gratification, (4) the frequency of actual trauma, including widespread child sexual abuse, as the origin of psychopathology, (5) countertransference disclosures and interpretations, and (6) understanding resistance as a function of countertransference.

This conference brings together many of the major Ferenczi scholars from Europe and from America interested in reexamining the work and legacy of this pioneer psychoanalysist.
